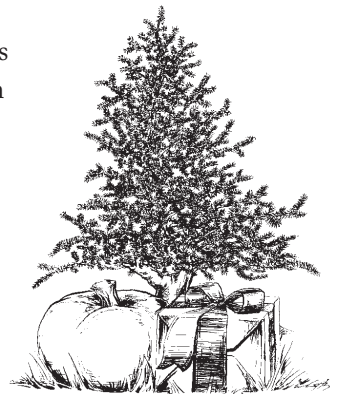

FROM THE PEN OF DR. GURJIT HERSHEY

Dear Kindervelt volunteers,

Thank you for your unwavering commitment to CCHMC and our children. The Division of Asthma Research at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center is honored to be the target for Kindervelt support for the next 4 years. We look forward to working with the Kindervelt organization to improve the health of children with asthma throughout our community.

Asthma is the most common childhood chronic disease in Ohio affecting one in every 6 children. It is the most common reason for pediatric hospital admission with nearly 3,000 emergency room (ER) visits for asthma at Cincinnati Children's Hospital last year. Furthermore, two thirds of all children with asthma report at least 1 attack in the last year highlighting the need for improvement around the management of asthma. Cincinnati is especially vulnerable to asthma for several reasons including (1) the high rate of allergies; Cincinnati is rated among the worst cities for allergen pollution in the US and has been called "allergy alley"; (2) a strong association with asthma and obesity; Ohio is ranked the 15th most obese state for both children and adults; and (3) air pollution contributes to asthma and Cincinnati has several major interstates that traverse the city and a very high density of truck traffic. Asthma primarily has its roots in early childhood, so in order to make a difference and impact the morbidity and mortality associated with asthma, it is critical to focus on children.

The mission of the Division of Asthma Research is to create a central base for research efforts in asthma around CCHMC, our Cincinnati community and in the Tri-state region to effect change and ensure the highest standards for asthma care. The central goal is to improve the health of children with asthma through a combination of clinically relevant research to understand the biologic basis for individual variations in asthma presentation, treatment response, and outcomes.

The Division has a multidisciplinary approach to accomplish its goals. The division includes physicians, scientists, environmental exposure epidemiologists, clinical research coordinators, computer application specialists, biostatisticians, quantitative geneticists, epidemiologists, post-doctoral researchers, database specialists, and research assistants. There are currently multiple ongoing federal funded studies investigating how asthma develops in early childhood, why asthma attacks occur, and which treatments are most effective. The support of Kindervelt is already making a difference. It has enabled the Division to recruit additional faculty, to fund programs and projects that enable us to leverage the Kindervelt monies to successfully compete for extramural funding, to help achieve the goals of the Ohio Statewide Asthma Plan including to "increase public awareness and understanding about the seriousness of asthma and its long-term effects throughout Ohio communities, to facilitate research on asthma in Ohio, and to reduce asthma incidents due to diesel and automobile emissions," and to impact new practices around healthcare for asthma.

On behalf of the children and families affected by asthma who will be positively impacted by Kindervelt support, as well as the Division of Asthma Research, I would like to thank all of the Kindervelt volunteers for their generous support. We look forward to working with Kindervelt over the next four years to improve the health of children with asthma. Thank you for your hard work, unwavering commitment, and relentless efforts to raise money to support our common goals.
