## Pitter Patter of Little Hearts...

NEWS FROM THE HEART INSTITUTE

The Heart Institute at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center is dedicated to serving the cardiac needs of patients and families. In many cases, these cardiac needs are not limited to surgical and/or medical intervention. They can also include patient/family education, identification of associated developmental delays and mental health care. With the vast majority of children with congenital and acquired heart disease surviving into adolescence and adulthood, families are now caring for children with increasingly complex disease and significant medical, social, and financial needs. Education is crucial to improve family functioning and patient-parent relationships, facilitate collaboration with the medical care team, and promote access to clinical and school resources.

On November 10, 2012, the Heart Institute hosted approximately 200 families for, **Navigating Pediatric Heart Diseases: An Education Day for Parents**; the first family conference targeted specifically to parents and caregivers. While other top pediatric cardiology programs in Philadelphia, Houston and Denver provide similar course offerings, this program leveraged our specific, nationally-recognized strengths in neurodevelopmental and educational support, psychosocial support and specialized adolescent and adult congenital care.

Limited educational opportunities exist in the local/regional area for the long-term care of a child, adolescent and young adult patient with heart disease. The Heart Institute offers a number of patient/family events, but this is the only educational event that focuses on the parent or caregiver. As a result of the limited interaction time and high-stress environment, inpatient and outpatient clinic visits are not always conducive to learning and long-term knowledge retention. A relaxed environment, focused agenda and freedom from daily interactions allowed parents and caregivers the unique opportunity to learn more about how they can manage their child's disease, while also letting them connect with other Congenital Heart Disease families. Through networking, families learn from the experiences of others and gain vital social support. The event was led by a committee comprised of patients, family members, and health care providers, ensuring the program is designed to meet families' needs.

Increased parental engagement and knowledge is associated with improved compliance, social support and quality of life. Parents and caregivers who are knowledgeable about their child's disease and treatment are advocates—getting them the clinical services and school services they need to optimize physical, emotional and school functioning. These parents and caregivers are also equipped to recognize signs of deterioration, complications or side effects sooner. This can result in decreased emergency room visits and hospitalizations as well as fewer days lost from school or work.

## Katrina's Crazy Kindervelt Story

Back in the early 1990's I remember we had a huge city-wide project called Tennithon. Some members of my group (at that time it was Kindervelt 63) and I went to the Peacock Pavilion building at the Cincinnati Zoo one winter evening to work on the billing mailers for Tennithon. The weather forecast was calling for snow and many of the ladies that had signed up to work cancelled due to the possible road conditions. We went and worked for quite a few hours trying to get the job completed with fewer people. When we finally finished and started to head out, we found our car was the only one left in the parking lot and it was buried in snow. After clearing the car off we headed out only to find that each exit we went to was closed. We were locked in the zoo! It was quite an experience. One member even got out and tugged on the chains thinking maybe they had just hung them but not actually locked them. No such luck. We didn't have cell phones and kept driving back and forth in the heavy snowstorm from one exit to the other to try to find someone to help us. We couldn't get back in the building we were working in to use the phone since we had locked it on our way out as we had been instructed to do. After about 20 minutes we were all having a really good laugh at the situation, but silently all wondering, "What are we going to do?" Right at the time that we started to get really desperate a security guard appeared out of nowhere and escorted us to the gate and let us out. That definitely ranks as one of my craziest Kindervelt moments!


